BIO STATEMENT: Rev. Carol Lakota Eastin, Lakota & Yakima

Rev. Carol Lakota Eastin is an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church. She holds a Bachelors in Music Education and Psychology from MacMurray College; a Master of Divinity and a Master of Arts in Christian Education from the Methodist Theological School in Ohio; and a Master of Arts in Counseling Psychology from Illinois State University. She was the founding pastor of Dayspring Native American United Methodist Church in East Peoria, IL.

She is a contributing author to multiple articles and books, is a frequent guest speaker at University classes, professional conferences, and as a Retreat Leader. Her journey includes raising two sons, serving as Pow Wow Director, 10 years as a Pastoral Counselor/ psychotherapist, pastoring local churches, GBGM missionary in the U.S. and 7 years as Superintendent of the Kaskaskia River District in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference. From 2008-2012, Carol served as co-chair of the task force for the United Methodist Act of Repentance Toward Healing Relationships With Indigenous Peoples, which was launched ceremonially at the UMC General Conference 2012.

Carol now serves as co-director of MorningSky Leadership Initiative, engaged in coaching Native American ministries and pastors. Currently, MorningSky is working on a significant research project "Healing with Dignity, Spiritual Care in Native America." Carol serves as chair of the NCJ Volunteers in Mission Board, serves on the NCJ CONAM and is on the board of the NAIC of the UMC. She is the faculty coordinator for the Native American Course of Study, which prepares local pastors serving in Native communities. Carol lives in Mt Vernon, IL with her husband Bill, a retired ordained elder. She has one son, Luke, and a granddaughter, Audrey who is 12 years old.
