This year has been one of change and challenge. October of 2020 brought us together via ZOOM for the first time. COVID 19 had done away with in person meetings, but thank God for the technology to help us continue.

At that time, we voted in several members of the executive committee, including Kae Wilbert as treasurer, Ellesa High as secretary, Cynthia Kent as nominations chair, and myself as chair, after having spent four years as secretary. I was stepping into enormous shoes. Cynthia Kent had been our fearless leader for twelve years, doing a phenomenal job in the process.
